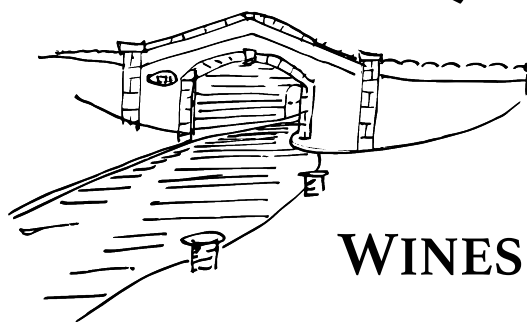

Cheese & Wine Pairing



Sainte-Maure de Touraine is a classic French goat's cheese produced in the province of Touraine.

It is an unpasteurized cheese made from full fat goat's milk, rolled in ash, and then aged for 3-5 weeks. It is a log shaped cheese, and once rolled a straw is placed through the centre, most of which are now laser etched with the AOC seal and the producers individual number.

The cheese has been protected by the AOC seal since 1990 where it was producing 275 tons of this lovely cheese but since then the production in the region has increased and now produces over 1500 tons. The Sainte-Maure de Touraine is now one of the largest produced goat's cheese AOC in France.

Mr Cooper's cellar suggestions

A cooper is someone who makes wine barrels for wine and other drinks to be stored in. Mr Cooper has been

involved with wine all his life and loves to suggest wines he has had the pleasure of enjoying himself.

Larry Cherubino 'Cherubino', Chardonnay: £32.00 per bottle

A focused, powerful, and creamy wine overall. Aromas of roasted nuts, peach and also sweet citrus blossom, complemented by complex oak spice. Citrus flavours and fine minerality lead to a refreshing finish.



Paringa Estate, Mornington Peninsula, Chardonnay: £32.55 per bottle

A slightly richer style than the Peninsula Chardonnay, with more weight and texture from the French oak barrels used. The honeyed notes are more prominent, and the ripe peach and lemon balm notes are offset by the typical, lifted acidity. All in all, a definite wine to be enjoyed with food.

Thistledown, Sulven Chardonnay: £37.00 per bottle

Refreshing white fruits, with a hint of spice and light oaking on the nose. Zippy acidity, white and stone fruits such as peach, together with some minerality adding texture.

World Wine Focus



Apart from being famous for kangaroos, koala bears and The Great Barrier Reef, Australia also has a very good reputation for producing some outstanding wines.

The vineyards of Australia cover an area of 150,000 hectares which is made up of six major regions, South Australia, Victoria, New South Wales, Western Australia, Tasmania, and Queensland. The grapes are grown, and the wine produced by around 2350 wineries and 6250 grape growers.

Australia produces more than 1.2 billion litres of wine each year and exports roughly 725 million litres of that, making them the 4th largest wine exporter in the world.

There are about 130 different grape varieties which are used in commercial production in Australia, but the main grapes are Shiraz, Pinot Noir, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc, Semillon & Riesling.
