St James has deep, complex, sweet & savoury flavours which makes a cheese you won't forget.

Produced by husband-and-wife team Martin &

Nicola Gott on their 20-acre farm in Cumbria, where they milk 100 sheep seasonally after lambing (Spring-Autumn).

The cheese comes in squares and is roughly 2kg in weight. Once the cheese is made it is then washed in brine three times a week which creates a striking yellow rind that contributes to the taste.

wine all his life and loves to suggest wines he has had the pleasure of enjoying himself.

Domaine Besson Givry Rouge les Haut Colombier: £24.25 per bottle

A classic Givry made from Pinot Noir; pale ruby in colour with a perfumed nose. The palate is clean and elegant, medium bodied with notes of redcurrants, red plum, and a perfumed note with a chalky, mineral character. Silky tannins add structure to the wine which finishes elegant and refined.



Domaine Jaeger-Defaix, Rully 1er Cru Rouge, Clos du Chapitre: £29.95 per bottle

This fine, elegant Clos du Chapitre is a very burgundian style of Pinot noir. Aromas of red and black fruit dominate the nose with violets and cherry in abundance. Fine, supple tannins and a refreshing acidity on the palate make this a truly remarkable bottle of Pinot.



Vallet Frères Gevrey-Chambertin: £35.40 per bottle

Delicate sweet strawberry fruit, fresh acidity and a clean, vibrant palate. A restrained style, with elegance and a savoury, autumnal finish.

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World Wine Focus



Germany is one of the most Northerly wine producing countries in the world, which is made up of 13 different growing areas mainly in the South and Southwest of the country along the river Rhine and its various tributaries.

Germany produces about 1.3 billion bottles per annum with roughly 65% of all the wine produced is white wine. The total area covered in vineyards is over 250,000 acres which makes Germany the eighth largest wine producing country in the world.

Germany grows nearly 100 different grape varieties, but the main grape used for production is Riesling, which produces wines that are fresh and crisp to a perfectly balanced sweet wine.
